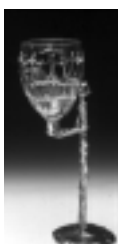
Lloyd Wolf, the award-winning photographer, follows the success of *Jewish Mothers* with a view of the relationships between fathers and off-

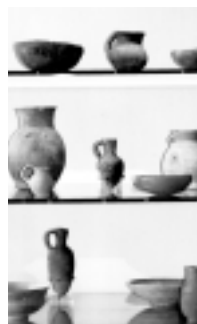
An interactive, multi-media environmental exhibition highlighting eyewitness testimonies

Highlighting the research and the archaeological expeditions of the Nelson Glueck School of Biblical Archaeology, the permanent exhibition presents the history and reconstruction of daily life of the inhabitants of three ancient cities: Laish/Dan, Gezer, and Aroer, and focuses on the major themes of fortifications, burial customs, and cult practices, as illustrated by artifacts, photographs, models, and plans. A special exhibit on *Ancient Inscriptions* from these excavations is on display in the Administration Building.
