Graduate School Summer Program in Israel

Rabbinical School Excavation Program



HUC-JIR Cincinnati in partnership with the Nelson Glueck School of Biblical Archaeology in Jerusalem is now accepting applications for the 2010 summer program. Graduate Program: June 7th through July 23rd. **Excavation only**, Rabbinical Program: June 13th through July 9th.

Graduate program: 7 weeks in Israel, including four weeks at Tel Dan archaeological excavation and 3 weeks in Jerusalem visiting local sites – ancient and modern, and travel throughout the Land of Israel. Graduate and Rabbinical Program: four weeks participating in the archaeological excavations at Tel Dan. There students take part in field work, pottery workshops, and attend lectures. Weekends are free for personal travel. Students can earn credit for one course upon completion of assignments. Some scholarships available.

We expect this summer's program to be a great intellectual and spiritual experience and encourage graduate students and rabbinical students to submit a letter of application stating their interest (including its significance to their academic work at HUC) and prior experience in Israel, if any. Applications will be accepted immediately; the deadline is December 1, 2009. Include a CV with your letter and submit to Ms. Lisa Jo Duffy, School of Graduate Studies.
